Each of the four Gospels makes mention of Barabbas--the guilty man released. This act in turn kept Jesus imprisoned and headed to the cross.

Barnabas loved Jesus and was committed to sharing Him with everyone--particularly Gentiles!

Similar names seemingly being the only thing they have in common.

But as we examine their stories, we see both were equally in need of Jesus' sacrifice!
