There are only a few verses about Lydia in the Bible. But reading Acts 16 shows us how intentional God is.

Paul had plans to share Jesus in many places and the Holy Spirit stopped him more than once.

Following God's lead, Paul went to Macedonia and soon began preaching to a group of women. One of those women was Lydia "a seller of purple goods, who was a worshiper of God." (Acts 16:14)

Lydia knew God but had not heard of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross...

...Until God rerouted Paul!

Pray for each person to know Jesus!

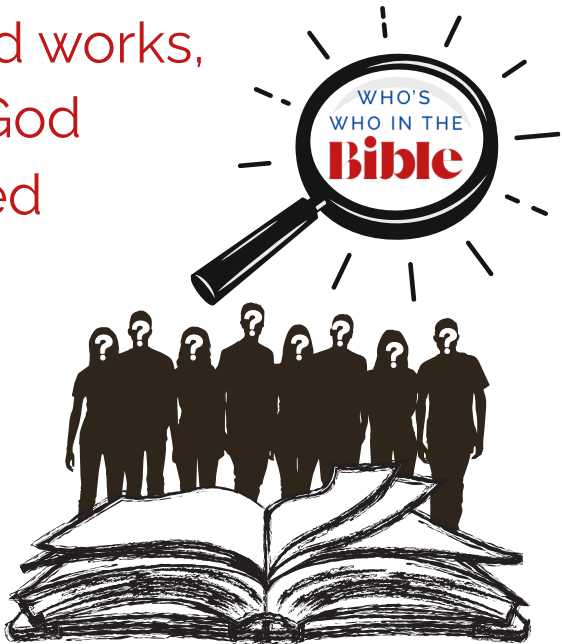
## CREATE
